LADDER SAFETY

OBJECTIVES

- Understand the practice of hazard identification and control.
- Identify the appropriate section (s) in the OSHA standard that governs the safety requirements for a given topic.
- Determine specific requirements regarding a given topic.

GUIDANCE

As a Safe Supervisor, you must be able to readily identify hazards in the workplace as well as know what to do about them when they are found.

In this exercise, you will view a picture or movie of work being done or of an accident that has already happened. In this exercise, you will:

- Identify a hazard(s)
- Classify the hazard(s) by type
- Identify the potential injury or illness
- Determine the types of control measures that should be taken to mitigate the hazard
- Determine who to communicate that information to, as well as how the information should be communicated
- Identify the government regulations that apply to this particular hazard or set of hazards

- 3. Identify three unsafe work practices while using ladders on the jobsite. List ways to correct these unsafe practices.
- 4. On a jobsite who shall inspect a ladder? Identify the location of the standard.
- 5. A ladder can be shifted while it is occupied. True or False? Note the section of the standard that supports your answer
